Bat Reserve Roost Recorder

This role suits those with patience, attention to detail and a willingness to volunteer as part of a team and take part in evening activities.

Commitment

- Two sunset counts between the end of May and beginning of July
- Two to three hours for each visit in addition to travel time to the reserves
- Attend a training workshop in Kenmare, including a visit to a bat reserve, on Sat 20 April, 4pm-10.30pm

What will you get in return?

- Learn how to count bats and use recording equipment
- Contribute to the conservation of a rare bat species in Ireland
- Dedicated staff to train you and share their knowledge
- The opportunity to meet new people and be actively involved, which may also bring wellbeing benefits.
